The Child Care Planning Council of Yuba & Sutter Counties (CCPC) includes program staff and the 20 Council members who meet monthly to represent both Yuba & Sutter counties. The Council liaisons between the local community and public/state government and agencies to assess access and promote high quality early learning experiences. CCPC supports families in understanding their choices in early learning experiences for children 0-5 and for before and after school care up through the age of 12. Council staff are here to answer questions and provide resources and publications including a licensed child care brochure, family resource brochure, and tip sheets to support developmentally appropriate and fun learning experiences with young children.

CCPC's Keys to Quality program provides direct support to all early learning settings, assisting state preschool, Head Start, center-based child care providers, family child care home providers, and extended family members, relatives, and friends who are helping to care for children in the home. Council staff provide technical assistance, coaching, professional development stipends, materials, and resources specifically for providers and programs in Yuba, Sutter, and Colusa counties. CCPC holds two ECE conferences each year in addition to a community Children's Fair and Provider Appreciation evening. The Council is the lead in local UPK planning for Yuba and Sutter counties, completing needs assessments and a community strategic plan to promote collaboration in program services between LEAS, community-based organizations, and partner agencies. ALAN CRUZ, MATH/SCIENCE TEACHER AT CARDEN

Mr. Cruz shared a project-based learning activity at Carden School. Camp students constructed Mars Rovers out of cardboard. The students learned that in the next twenty years, NASA will be working on sending astronauts to Mars and eventually colonization will occur. Students practiced mathematical concepts by finding area of geometric shapes and using a ruler to find measurement in inches and centimeters; down to 1/16th of an inch and .1 of a centimeter. In the next coming months, students will be working with CTE teacher Dan McAllister to renovate and restore a portable shower trailer donated to Yuba County for use at the annual Yuba/Sutter Stand Down. Mr. Cruz is a veteran of the United States Air Force and looks forward to working with Dan and the students to represent Yuba County Office of Education and give back to our community of veterans.
